# Eric Dever b. 1962 Los Angeles

## Summary -

Over the last decade, Eric Dever has pursued intensely focused investigations into methods and materials, creating works which gradually have evolved into sensitively executed and intimate works of art. Dever was born in Los Angeles, California and received his Bachelors Degree from California Lutheran University, Thousand Oaks. He moved to the East Coast to study at New York University where he received his Master of Arts. Recently, Guild Hall Museum, East Hampton, New York acquired a painting by Dever.

For several years, Dever limited his palette to white—Zinc and Titanium White -- enabling him to uncover a white spectrum ranging from opacity to translucency. In the past, his compositions were largely geometric, including circles graded from dark to light. These compositions included the introduction of black, widening the range and force of the work. His approach reflects the artist's interest in the spiritual and the shift from matter (black) to energy (red) to self-realization (white).

Dever's more recent paintings are explorations through and beyond formal inquiry. While the grid still resides within, each painting emerges into free shapes and tactile surfaces executed with brush and knife. The starting point for this current series was simply a rose from the artist's garden that he deconstructed. His methods, while still conceptual, enabled him to let the energetic qualities of color, line, and form emerge. Yet, in the paintings, Dever holds the methodical in the presence of the free. Utterly distinct marks suggest looping links of color, which serve to present the artist's discoveries of richer and rarer hues—especially red, a color of love and strength. These hues in turn give the paintings a sense of active and light filled passion. The most recent of these paintings represent a variation on the original rose with the additional element of the rose's stamen. This new elemental form in the center of the canvas allows the viewer to see the rose itself as a micro or macrocosm.

Since the early 1990s, Dever's work has been included in numerous one-person and group exhibitions in New York, Illinois, Ohio, Texas, New Mexico, and France. Last spring, he participated in *REDACTED*, an exhibition at the Islip Art Museum, New York curated by Janet Goleas. Last summer, Dever had a solo show at Berry Campbell Gallery followed by a solo museum exhibition at the Gertrude and Frank Kaiser Art Gallery, Molloy College, Rockville Centre, New York entitled, *Eric Dever: The Rose Chapel*. This fall, New York University will host a solo exhibition of Dever's work.

Dever currently lives and works in Water Mill, New York on Long Island's East End. He is regular instructor at the Parrish Art Museum, Water Mill and the Madoo Conservancy, Sagaponack. Eric Dever is exclusively represented by Berry Campbell Gallery, New York.
